It was in May of 2017 when Texas House Representative Victoria Neave filed House Bill 2698, which was later incorporated into Texas Senate Bill 805 and signed into Law by Governor Greg Abbott, designating June 12 as Women's Veterans Day. On Monday, June 12, at 11:30 am, the Veterans Service Office is hosting a Women Veterans Day Luncheon to honor and recognize women veterans in Atascosa County who have served.
