## How to obtain a Certificate of Occupancy

A "Certificate of Occupancy" means a certificate issued by the County Fire Marshal indicating Construction or Substantial Improvement is in compliance with the Atascosa County Fire Code as of a specific date and for a specific occupancy. A Certificate of Occupancy under this Fire Code shall not be construed as authorizing the owner or operator of any building to afterward operate or maintain such building in such a way as to create, cause or allow the existence of a fire or life safety condition, which condition shall be subject to the independent enforcement authority of the County Fire Marshal.

No.	Guidelines	Completed
1	Complete the Building Permit Application with a signed	
	authorization form from Rural Development Staff.	
	If you are constructing (new building), remodeling or opening as a	
	new business in an existing location you will need to obtain a	
	Building Permit.	
	(Applies to Unincorporated Areas of Atascosa County).	
2	Submit 2 copies of building plans or 1 digital copy along with	
	Building Permit Application to the Fire Marshal's Office at 711	
	Broadway Jourdanton, Texas 78026, for plan review.	
	(See Required Information on Building Plan).	
3	Once construction or remodeling begins post the permit on-site as	
	required by the Fire Code - it is likely an inspector will check by to	
	verify this facility has a permit.	
4	If you have any type of fire alarm or suppression system in your	
	facility, you must have the installer call for a system inspection	
	prior to your final building inspection.	
5	Upon completion of each permit a "Request for Final Inspection"	
	must be submitted to the Fire Marshal's Office.	
6	Once you have submitted all documentation you will be contacted	
	by a Fire Inspector to schedule your inspection. Please allow up to	
	(5) days; you must allow time for scheduling and an inspection	
	when planning the date to open your business. You may <b>NOT OPEN</b>	
	for business without a Certificate of Occupancy.	
7	The inspector will require the final approved revised as-builts	
	drawings on site for the facility and any fire protection systems	
	installed.
